Paper 1: Reading and Directed Writing | 2 hours | 50 marks

Reading | 30 marks

- Read a Gaelic text and answer questions in English – 20 marks
- Gaelic to English translation 10 marks
- Dictionary permitted

Directed Writing | 20 marks

- Choose one writing question from a choice of two.
- A dictionary is permitted.

Writing Assignment | 20 marks

- Candidates must produce one piece of writing (200-250 words) using detailed and complex language based on one of the following contexts: Society, Employability, Learning or Culture.
- The piece of writing should be discursive in nature. Candidates should express/discuss different viewpoints. They should give reasons for their opinions and draw conclusions.
- The piece of writing will be submitted to SQA in March for marking.

Talking Exam | 10 minutes | 30 marks

- This is worth 30 marks in total
- Candidates will take part in a discussion using detailed and complex language on at least two different contexts. The exam will last approximately 10 minutes.
- The exchange of information is mainly of a factual basis but will also include ideas and opinions.

Paper 2: Listening | 30 minutes | 20 marks

Reading | 30 marks

- Listen to a short monologue in Gaelic and answer questions in English – 8 marks
- Listening to a conversation and answer questions in English – 12 marks
