Social Studies visit to Auschwitz

Sgoil Lionacleit is extremely proud of two of our S5 pupils who participated in a thought provoking project run by the Holocaust Educational Trust this November. Floraidh Gray and Viktoria Kuzma made a journey to the memorial site at Auschwitz in Poland which was formerly a Nazi concentration camp.



On this journey they took a guided tour of the camp during which they saw artefacts and learned about many of the atrocities that took place there. This would certainly not have been easy. Floraidh and Viktoria showed considerable levels of maturity in undertaking this project. In addition to the journey to Poland the two students also attended two seminars which took place in Glasgow to ensure that they got the most out of their visit to Auschwitz.



Sgoil Lionacleit History department look forward to working with both pupils as they design their own system for disseminating what they have learned throughout the whole school community.

For example: £18 can pay for warm blankets to help people survive low temperatures in emergencies, £39 can help run a mobile medical centre to give refugees vital care and support, and £85 can help a refugee child get the education and support they need. National Gàidhlig Debate



O chionn ghoirid bhuannaich sinn Deasbad Naiseanta Gàidhlig nan Àrd-sgoiltean. Am bliadhna bhathar a' comharrachadh fichead bliadhna den deasbad 's mar sin bha a' chuairt dheireannach ann an seòmar-deasbaid na Pàrlamaid.

Bha sinn airson a dhèanamh air saillibh 's gun do chòrd e rinn nuair a rinn sinn e airson a' chiad turas air an dàrna bliadhna. Bha sinn òg a' chiad turas a rinn sinn e ach tha sinn air tighinn air adhart a thaobh misneachd agus sgilean deasbaid on uair-sin.

Bha ceithir cuairtean ann agus bha sia sgiobaidhean deug a' gabhail pàirt. Bha a' chiad dà chuairt ann an Steòrnabhagh air a' 5mh agus an 6mh latha den t-Samhain agus fhuair sinn troimhe chun an iar-chuairt dheireannach ann an Dun Eideann.

Chòrd an turas a Steòrnabhagh rinn gu mòr; bha e math a bhith a' coinneachadh ri daoine òg eile aig an robh ùidh ann an Gàidhlig. Chuala sinn iomadh deasbad inntinneach eadar na sgiobaidhean eile. Bha e doirbh a chreidsinn gun do rinn sinn a' ghnòthach agus gun robh sinn a' dol dhan chuairt dheireannach ann am Pàrlamaid na h-Alba.

Thòisich sinn air barrachd obair a dhèanamh air a' chuairt dheireannach an ath latha. Bha sinn an aghaidh sgioba Sir E Scott agus bha cuspair doirbh againn,

"S ann anns na bailtean mòra a bhios na fìor choimhearsnachdan Gàidhlig ann am fichead bliadhna"

Bha sinn an aghaidh a' mhòlaidh, 's mar sin bha againn ri cur sìos air a' choimhearsnachd againn fhèin, rud a bha gu math doirbh. Bha sinn air bhioran agus uabhasach nearbhach chionn 's gu robh sinn a' dol a bhith a' deasbad anns an àite far am bi luchd-poilitigs mòra na dùthcha againn ag argamaid: anns an t-seòmar-deasbaid mhòr! Bha an deasbad a' dol a-mach beò air Rèidio nan Gaidheal agus air loidhne air tìbh na Pàrlamaid. Nuair a fhuair sinn a-mach gun do bhuannaich sinn bha sinn uabhasach toilichte oir cha robh dùil againn gum bitheadh sinn a' tilleadh air ais a dh' Uibhist leis a' chupa mhòr.

Tha sinn uabhasach fortanach gun robh an cothrom seo againn agus neartaich e sgilean a bh'againn a leithid a bhith ag obair ann an sgioba, sgilean rannsachaidh agus sgilean deasbaid. Bha e cuideachd math airson misneachd a thoirt dhuinn nuair a tha sinn a' bruidhinn air beulaibh dhaoine.

Recently Sgoil Lionacleit won the National Gàidhlig Debate. This year the Debate celebrated its twentieth year and this meant that the final round was held in the actual debating chamber of the Scottish Parliament, as this year also marks the twentieth year of the Scottish Parliament. Marion and I wanted to take part because we enjoyed it when we took part way back in second year. We were much younger the first time round but we feel we have grown in confidence and developed our debating skills since then.

There were 4 rounds with 16 teams. The first two rounds took place in Stornoway on the 5th and 6th of November and we got through to the semi-finals in Edinburgh. We enjoyed the trip to Stornoway very much and it was good to meet up with other young people who had an interest in Gàidhlig. It was also good to listen to other teams debating on a range of interesting topics. When we found out that we were going to Edinburgh we were so excited!

Our topic for the semi-final was "Fitbits are helpful for keeping us healthy" and we were against Inverness Royal Academy. We started work on the topic as soon as we returned to school. There was lots of work to do: we did lots of research and lots of thinking!

The semi-finals took place in the MacDonald Hotel Holyrood. This debate made us and the audience laugh and therefore it was great fun! We were successful in the semi-finals and it was difficult to believe that the following evening we were going to be in the final and debating at the Scottish Parliament!

We worked hard on the topic for the final the next day. We were up against Sir E Scott and we had a challenging topic:

"The main Gàidhlig communities will be found in the cities in twenty years!"

We were against the motion which meant that we had to be very critical of our own community and this was challenging. We were excited but also very nervous to be debating in the debating chamber – the room in which the main politicians in our country debate. The debate was being broadcast live on Radio nan Gaidheal and online on Parliament TV.

When we found out we had won we were so happy as we had not expected to return to Uist with the big cup!

We are very fortunate to have had this opportunity as it strengthened skills such as working together in a team and also research and debating skills. It was also good as it gave us confidence to speak in front of an audience.

We would like to thank everyone who helped us: Mrs MacEachen, Mrs Parkin and Miss Ferguson for the support and advice they gave us; Alasdair MacEachen and Oisín Buckley for coming with us on the trips. We would also like to thank other teachers who helped by giving us time out of class to prepare for the debate when that was needed. We would also like to thank everyone at Sgoil Lionacleit and the wider community for being so kind and sending us good wishes and messages of congratulations.
