Graeme had a packed day in Benbecula and started with a presentation delivered to S1-3s focussing on how he got involved in sport and what it took for him to be successful on an international level. He discussed how he coped with failure by learning from mistakes and realising that there are always ups and downs on the journey to being successful.

He then spent second period with the S2 HE class where he talked about the importance of Nutrition for a healthy lifestyle while showing them how to cook Beef Fajitas.

North of Scotland Schools Championships 2017

On the 31st of May, pupils from lochdar, Balivanaich, Sgoil Uibhist a Tuath and Sgoil Lionacleit travelled to Inverness to compete at the North of Scotland Schools Track and Field Championships. The children all competed amazingly well. Here are the medal winners.

The first medal to come our way was from Uilleum Brass, placed 2nd in his triple jump with a strong jump of 11.74m. Liam MacKinnon also attended the triple jump competition, jumping a PB of 9.55m. Next to the pit was the throwing circle where the shot putt took place where Marion MacCorquodale threw a massive amount onto her PB with a throw of 9.55m, Onto discus, Marion gained another medal into her pocket with a 3rd place throw of 16.48m, while Finlay MacDonald threw a strong throw of 18.56m. On the other side of the field, our only competitor in the javelin, Ryan Mac Intyre threw 25.39m giving him 2nd place. In the hurdles Trinity Johnson got 3rd in her 80m hurdles and PB'd with a fast time of 13.60s. John Scanlon got 1st in 80m hurdles for U15 boys with a PB of 13.68 and he also reached the final of 100m. Calum Fraser, a senior pupil competed in a straight final of the 100m and 200m for the U20 A boys. He achieved gold in both events, a PB in 100m 11.65s and 24.19s in the 200m.

We had 3 relay teams competing in the last event of the day. Our U13 girls team was Elisa Morrison, Emma MacCormick, Amie Ringstead and Orin Shepard. Our Under 17 girls team was Emily Steele, Erin MacKinnon, Trinity Johnson and Shona Steele. Both of these girls teams were delighted to achieve 2nd place! We also had a U15 boys boys relay team, Angus MacDonald, Liam MacKinnon, Ryan MacDonald and John Scanlon. They ran a fantastic race. A very successful and enjoyable trip was had. Well done to everyone who attended. We would like to thank Ms Levack and Mr MacDonald for driving the minibuses and accompanying us on the trip.


